# Annual Report 2009-2010



### A Letter to the Community

The past year has been a challenging one for many in the community, and the library has continued to focus on what it can do to help during these difficult times. The library has redoubled its efforts to provide job

search assistance and programming while continuing to deliver educational, cultural and recreational resources at a price that can't be beat.

In addition to offering programs on resume and cover letter basics, researching career options, searching online job sites and filling out online applications, the library unveiled a Job Search Assistance Station where job searchers can get one-on-one assistance. For those who have difficulty getting to the library, the new Library2Go service, unveiled in May 2010, now brings library materials and service to residents at their homes.

In March 2010, library building overcrowding was temporarily addressed with the opening of a mobile annex housing the Children's Area. The temporary annex also provides space allowing some library programs to again be held on-site.

All of this would not have been possible without the generous support of the community, our volunteers and the Friends' Foundation. Thank you, the library looks forward to serving you in the year ahead.

Our mission is to encourage lifelong learning and to improve the quality of life in our community. We strive to maintain the highest possible standards of service, by providing cultural, recreational, and informational resources to our growing and changing population.

### **Donations & Giving to the Library**

Despite difficult economic conditions, community support for the library continues to grow. Both monetary and commemorative book donations increased during the 2009-2010 fiscal year, while volunteers donated 5,117.75 hours, saving the library an estimated \$48,618.

In October 2009, the "Creating a Legacy" donation program was established, allowing donors to memorialize their donations of \$100 to \$49,999 with a plaque in the library. "Creating a Legacy" donors can choose to have their contributions put towards a building expansion or where most needed. During the first ten months of the program, donors have contributed more than \$48,000 in "Creating a Legacy" funds to the library.

The library is very grateful to all those who continue to generously support its mission and the "Creating a Legacy" program.

#### 2009-10 Achievements

- Circulation record: 621,817 items were loaned to patrons in the 2009-10 fiscal year, more than 22 times the number loaned when the library opened in 1997.
- The library was awarded a grant from the State of Illinois to install power assist doors, new bathroom counters, sinks and faucets, and new water fountains.
- Collection record: 115,460 books and other items are now available to patrons.
- The addition of a 2,880 square foot temporary annex provided space for the new Children's Area and a small Program Room.

• Over 40 dedicated volunteers gave more than 1000 hours of their time to help the library operate smoothly.

- A new Job Search Assistance Station opened in February to help residents look for employment, and update their skills.
- New Children's and Teen Websites were unveiled.
- A new Library2Go service was made available to residents who cannot come to the library due to illness, injury or lack of transportation.
- New Library Director, Patrick McDonald, began in December 2009.





An electronic device counts the number of people visiting the library each day.


