

Huntley Area Public Library District Annual Report 2010 - 2011

A Letter to the Community



Libraries are about value, and this past year, with the help of an outstanding community of supporters, the Huntley Area Public Library was able to provide residents, who used the library more often than ever, an even greater return for their investment. For the year, monetary and commemorative book donations increased, and the tireless fundraising efforts of the Friends' Foundation allowed the library to purchase, among other items, access to HelpNow!, an online tutoring and job assistance service.

The library also purchased DVD shelving from liquidating Borders Bookstores with money donated by the Friends Foundation. The purchase saved the library approximately \$25,000

over the cost of new shelving. Additionally, dedicated library volunteers gave 5,634 hours of their time during the year, saving district residents approximately \$50,000.

Thank you to all those who continue to give of their time, talents and resources in support of the community and the library. Your efforts continue to help the library provide exceptional value to the community.

2010-2011 Achievements





- Check-out record: 638,588 library items were loaned to residents in the 2010-11 fiscal year.
- Record number of library cardholders: Nearly 63% of residents served by the library district now have a library card.
- Record number of library items: 120,700 items are locally available, and thousands of additional items are available through interlibrary loan from other libraries.
- The number of eBooks borrowed this year grew by 95%.
- Library Facebook friends increased by 32%, and Twitter followers increased by 43% this year.
- More than 27,400 people attended educational and cultural library programs held during this past year.

2010-2011 Grant Review

The library actively seeks and applies for grant funding to purchase materials, pay for special projects and events, update technology and equipment, enhance the facility, and support general operations.

The following grants were received in the 2010-2011 fiscal year:

- Per Capita Grant \$35,436.89
 - Purchase of materials to expand the library collection
- Target 2012 Grant \$2,000
 - Sponsorship of children's 2012 Summer Reading Program.
- ISLMA Monarch Book Collection Set
 - Set of Monarch books to be added to the collection. Estimated value of \$300.

Additionally, grant funds previously awarded but received in this fiscal year purchased power-assist doors, new bathroom countertops, sinks and faucets, and new drinking fountains.







Number of Library Visitors





2010-2011 Highlights

Huntley Area Public Library District

July 2010	The Summer Reading Program, sponsored by the Friends Foundation, has close to 4,000 participants.
August 2010	An Illinois State <i>Live & Learn</i> Grant in the amount of \$10,394 and a matching donation from the Friends Foundation allowed the library to install power assist doors, upgrade public bathrooms and install new water fountains.
September 2010	The library partners with local businesses to provide library cardholders with discounts during National Library Card Month.
December 2010	The seventh Annual Holiday Open House hosts 514 guests in two hours.
January 2011	The Library adds HelpNow, an online service with live tutors and an adult learning center, paid for by the Friends Foundation.
February 2011	Three Sony eReaders are added to the collection and made available for checkout. The Tumblebook Library, an ebook library for children, makes its debut. Bibliocommons, an intuitive online interface for finding library items, is introduced.
April 2011	A collection of Wii games is made available for checkout.
May 2011	Three Nook color eReaders are added to the collection and made available for checkout.
June 2011	New DVD shelving is purchased (from liquidating Borders Bookstores) at a fraction of the cost of new shelving. Record-breaking circulation surpasses 638,500 items loaned to members of the community.
