Kanopy is a new streaming movie service available to Huntley Area Public Library cardholders. You can use Kanopy on your tablet, smartphone, computer, or smart TV. Stream a wide variety of content for all ages anytime, anywhere to your preferred devices with no fees and no commercials.

Visit huntleylibrary.kanopy.com or download the Kanopy app from the Google Play or Apple store to get started. You'll need to enter your library card information and create a Kanopy account. If you have a Roku or Amazon Fire Stick or Roku or Amazon Fire TV, you can add Kanopy to your device after you create your Kanopy account.

Once you set up your account, you'll have access to movies, TV series, incredible documentaries from PBS and the BBC, and the Great Courses, an acclaimed collection of video lectures featuring professors and experts explaining complex topics in an engaging, clear manner.

For the kiddos, there is a special section to explore – Kanopy Kids. This area is full of quality content specifically for children ages two and up, with a focus on ages 2-8, and best of all kids can enjoy unlimited plays.

With your library card you can watch up to 5 films per month, 1 series from the Great Courses and enjoy unlimited plays in Kanopy Kids. New content is added weekly.




