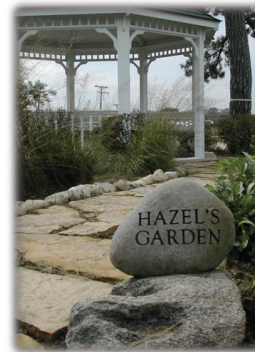

In Honor of Hazel Kloempken

In 1988 the population of Huntley numbered about 2500, and a small group of residents decided it was time to establish a library. One of the leaders was Hazel Kloempken, a long time Huntley resident.

Since this time the population of the area and demands on the library have grown, and today the library serves more than 39,000 residents. In 2009 for the twentieth anniversary of the library district the Legacy Fund was established in Hazel's honor.

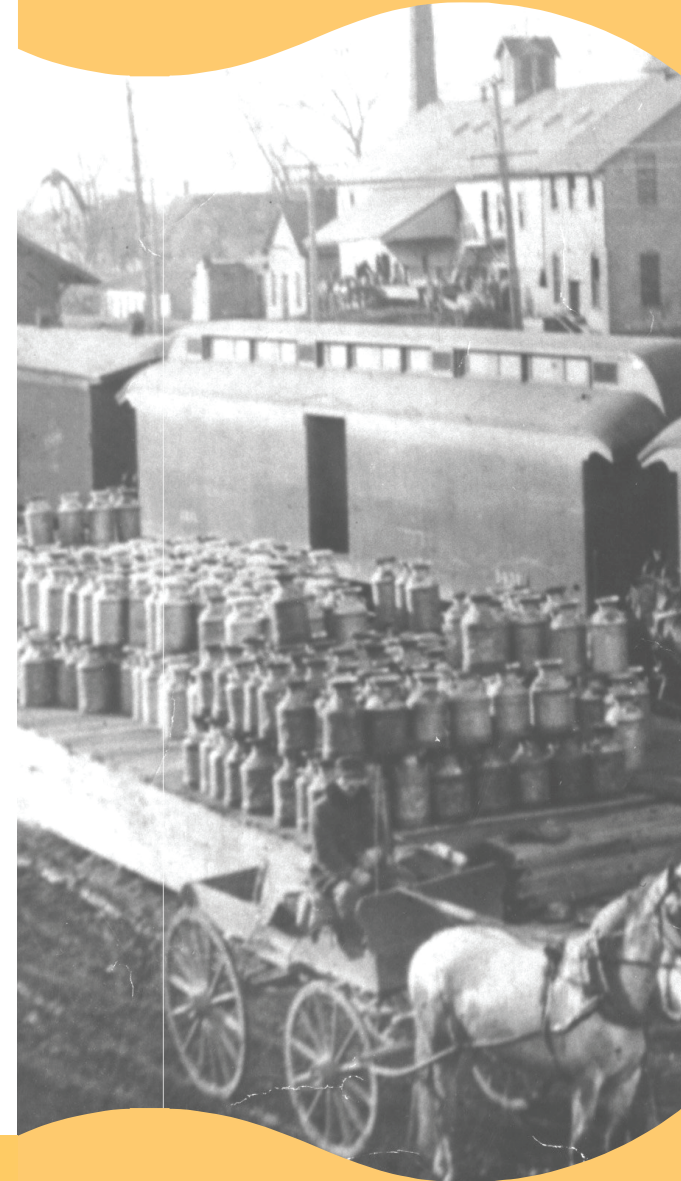
