Everyone Counts!



Make time to complete your 2020 census!

Census information determines how billions of dollars in federal funding flow into our State, how many seats in Congress each state gets, the amount of funding our community receives for things like school lunch programs, highways, aid for struggling families, wildlife preservation, grants to public bodies (like the library), support for hospitals and fire departments, and more.

Timeline

- In mid-March, homes across the country will begin receiving invitations to complete the 2020 Census. Once the invitation arrives, respond for your home in one of three ways: online, by phone, or by mail.
- When completing the census, include everyone living in your home on April 1, 2020. Official census takers will count those not living at your residence on April 1st, including college students, seniors in an assisted living facility, and military personnel.
- From May through July, census takers will begin visiting homes that have not yet responded to the Census.

How can you verify that someone is a Census worker?

Census takers may visit homes in April to conduct quality check interviews and in mid-May to help collect responses if you have not already completed your census online. If someone visits your home to collect information for the 2020 Census, be sure that they have a valid ID badge with their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date. Census workers may also carry Census Bureau bags or other equipment with the Census Bureau logo. If you still have questions about their identity, contact your Regional Census Center to speak with a Census representative at 312-579-1500.

Avoiding Scams

The Census Bureau will not send unsolicited emails to request your participation in the 2020 Census. Further, during the 2020 Census, the Census Bureau will never:

- Ask for your Social Security number
- Ask for your bank account or credit card numbers
- Ask for money or donations
- Contact you on behalf of a political party

Your privacy

The Census Bureau is legally required to keep your information confidential. The law ensures that your private data is protected and answers cannot be used against you by any government agency or court. The answers you provide are used only to produce statistics. You are kept anonymous. The Census Bureau is not permitted to publicly release your responses in any way that could identify you or anyone else in your home.

Need to use a computer?

If you need to use a computer to complete your census online, the library will have additional computers available beginning mid-March. Staff members can help you get started if you need assistance. Please bring any paperwork you received from the census to help you complete the online version.

HUNTLEY LIBRARY HOLDS GROUNDBREAKING; CONSTRUCTION BEGINS

On Wednesday, February 19, the Huntley Area Public Library Board of Trustees held its official groundbreaking ceremony for the expansion and renovation project, for which a \$12.9 million bond was approved by voters on April 2, 2019. In attendance were about 60 members of the community, including representatives from the Village of Huntley, other taxing bodies, the project architects and construction management team, members of the Friends Foundation, and volunteers who helped with the referendum campaign.



"After many months of finalizing building schematics and floorplans, working with architects and the construction management team, receiving bids from the trades, and performing pre-construction tasks, the work can finally begin," stated Library Director Frank Novak.

The ceremony included short speeches from Novak, Library Board President Chris Budzynski, project architect Alison Andrews of Wold Architects and Engineers, Derek Ward of Gilbane Building Company, and Huntley Mayor Chuck Sass who presented Novak with a Certificate of Recognition for the hard work and dedication of the Library Trustees and staff. Novak spoke of the public engagement process that sought feedback from the community, the support and energy from residents, and thanked the many volunteers and groups that made this project possible.

Project milestones include the completion of the addition to the east side of the building by April 2021, whereupon all library materials and staff will be moved to that area. Phase two construction will include the renovation of the current library, which will conclude around December 2021. A grand opening celebration is estimated for January 2022.

PARKING LOT/BOOK DROPS

Access to the book drops at the library has changed due to the start of the building program construction. For everyone's safety, construction fencing and a construction entrance have been put into place eliminating access to a section of the library parking lot. This may alter how you access the book drops.

Please note the new the new traffic pattern and changes in parking spaces.

When construction is complete, the new library will feature a drive-through window and book drop where you can return and pickup materials!


Why get an account now?





The library has two easy-to-use services, **Freegal Music** and **Hoopla Digital**, that offer you the option of streaming your favorite songs and exploring new tunes.

Freegal and **Hoopla** have apps available for your phone or tablet that let you stream music wherever you go, as long as you have data or wi-fi available. While these tremendous services are a lot alike, they also have some distinct differences.

Freegal offers music that you may stream up to 8 hours per day. In addition, you may download and KEEP 5 Mp3 files every week! Check out their catalog with thousands of songs at huntleylibrary.freegalmusic.com and set up your account.

Music is just a part of the variety available at **Hoopla**. Setting up an account is easy, just visit hoopladigital.com. Check out full albums and stream them for 7 days. You may borrow up to 5 items per month.




